

NEW RATES TO TAKE EFFECT MARCH 1ST

After a thorough budget review, the Board of Commissioners approved a rate increase of \$2.00 per month effective March 1, 2008 representing a 10.25% increase since the last increase which occurred January 1, 2006. We still retain the second lowest rates among King County sewer agencies.

The District has been hit hard by inflation in oil prices, which caused dramatic increases in fuel, asphalt and pipe prices. The District has also been impacted by emergency repairs such as the helicopter work near the Miller Creek Treatment Plant, emergency pipe repairs and a pump station on Three Tree Point.

The two treatment plants, updated in the 1980's to provide secondary treatment, are now over twenty years old and need updating of computerized controls and equipment.

The Board of Commissioners is very concerned about rate impacts on low-income households and is continuing the policy of passing only 50% of the rate increase through to households qualifying for the low-income discounted rate. Be sure and contact the District if you think you may qualify for the low-income rate.
