# Ratepayer News

## 2017 SEWER RATES

Effective March 1, 2017, our sewer rate will increase from \$31.50 to \$32.75 per month. Your Board of Commissioners, along with the District Manager, work diligently to keep the sewer rates affordable while still addressing the unique requirements of the District. Southwest Suburban Sewer is one of only two sewer districts in Washington State that operates two separate wastewater treatment plants. In addition, our District has an aging sewer collection infrastructure, much of which is 60+ years old and requires an ongoing rehabilitation and improvement program.

The improvements assure quality sewer service collected from your home, moved through our pump stations, and finally processed through one of the two secondary wastewater treatment plants before being discharged into Puget Sound (while exceeding all Department of Ecology requirements). Balancing these needs with keeping rates at a level our ratepayers can afford is the primary challenge that faces the Board and management. *A detailed chart of King County Sewer rates is included on page 2 for your information.*

## CITY OF DES MOINES IMPLEMENTS 6% FRANCHISE CHARGE

Ratepayers within the City of Des Moines have seen a 6% utility franchise payment added to their sewer bills as of August 1, 2016. The District is required to collect the payment and forward it to the City of Des Moines. The original goal of the City was to collect a 16% utility tax, but thanks to the joint efforts of SWSSD, Midway Sewer District and Highline Water District, a ten year

agreement was reached with the City of Des Moines. The agreement, reached after months of negotiations, required SWSSD to pay a \$5000 franchise fee to the City in addition to the ongoing 6% charge all for the right to operate within the City's public rights of way. ## YOUR SEWER DOLLARS AT WORK

### ADMINISTRATION & MAINTENANCE FACILITY UNDER CONSTRUCTION

You may have driven by the construction site of the District's new administrative and maintenance facility on Des Moines Memorial Drive South at the site of the old YMCA. Construction should be complete by the end of 2017 and we will be able to move into the much needed larger facility.

The new facility will house all staff (except for wastewater treatment plant staff), eliminating the need for two separate facilities for administrative staff and the employees who maintain our sewer lines. It will also accommodate District vehicles and equipment, some of which are too large to be parked inside our current maintenance facility. There will also be a much more accessible public meeting space.
